Birth defects can occur in any family regardless of race, health history, economic status,

or level of education; and

WHEREAS:

A baby is born with a birth defect every 4.5 minutes, affecting one in every 33 babies in

the United States, and more than 2,000 babies born in Minnesota each year; and

WHEREAS:

Birth defects cause 1 in every 5 deaths in infants nationwide and almost 100 infant deaths

every year in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS:

Congenital heart defects, conditions present at birth, which affect the structure and

function of the heart, are among the most common birth defects, affecting nearly 40,000

infants born in the United States each year; and

WHEREAS:

Early identification of a child with a birth defect, coupled with early intervention

services, improve the child's quality of life and may even save the child's life; and

WHEREAS:

About half of all pregnancies are unplanned, contributing to late entry into prenatal care

and optimal pregnancy management, particularly during the critical, early weeks of

embryonic development; and

WHEREAS:

To decrease the number of babies born with birth defects in Minnesota and across the country, the month of January is dedicated each year to raising awareness about birth defects and strategies for their prevention. Preventive strategies include taking a daily multivitamin with folic acid; avoiding alcohol and tobacco use; maintaining a healthy weight; regular doctor visits; learning about family history and genetic risks; and managing maternal medical conditions while minimizing unnecessary medication

exposure in pregnancy; and

WHEREAS:


