Absentee Ballot Board Recommended Challenge Process Guidelines

- Challengers have a right to challenge <u>accepted</u> Absentee Ballots at the Absentee Ballot Board. (M.S. 204C.13 Subd. 6)
- Ballot Board meeting times should be posted so that challengers know when to be present for challenging. For example:
 - o Monday, Wednesday and Fridays at 2 p.m.; or
 - o Daily after 1 p.m.; or
 - o Daily during business hours at call of county auditor; or
 - o Other timeline convenient for particular AB Board situation.
- The statute only authorizes the challenge of accepted absentees ballots. A decision to reject a ballot may not be challenged.
- Accepting/Rejecting occurs throughout the entire absentee period. Ballots must be accepted/rejected within 5 days of receipt if received more than 14 days before the election; and within 3 days of receipt if received during the 14 days immediately before the election.
- Voters whose ballots are rejected more than 5 days before the election must be sent a replacement ballot; the election official must attempt to contact the voter if ballot is rejected within 5 days of the election. To ensure that voters have an opportunity to correct any errors that led to the rejection of their ballot, any challenge must be made at the time that the ballot is accepted/rejected.
- Challengers must provide a written letter from a political party, or nonpartisan candidate. (Note: M.S. 204C.07 challenge process is being used in lieu of other statutory guidance for an Absentee Ballot Board challenge process).
- Only one challenger for each major party (or one challenger for each nonpartisan candidate, or a challenger appointed for a question) is allowed per team of ballot board members who are accepting/rejecting ballots together.
- Challengers become part of the official process and are able to view private data only for purpose of determining a challenge.
- Challengers cannot keep a list of who they did or did not challenge, since the names are not public until after the polls close; and a challenger cannot prepare in any manner any list of who has or has not voted.
- Challenger must put the challenge in writing (see attached form).
- If challenged, a team of Election Judges of the board reviews the ballot envelope and if a majority agree that the ballot meets the legal requirements and should be accepted, then the voter's ballot has overcome the challenge and the ballot is accepted. Election Judges must document the result of the challenge in the "election judge use only" section of the challenge form.
- If the team of Election Judges agree that the ballot envelope does not meet the legal requirement and should be rejected, then the challenge is upheld and the ballot is rejected. The Election Judges must document the result of the challenge in the "election judge use only" section of the challenge form. The local election official must either send a replacement ballot or attempt to contact the voter.
- Counting of ballots after close of the polls on Tuesday is open to the public.
