Proclamation

WHEREAS: In 2008, 455 people died on Minnesota highways and 33,379 were injured; and

WHEREAS: Eighty percent of all crashes occur within three seconds of a driver distraction event; and

WHEREAS: Many fatalities could be avoided by simply following safe driving practices such as using hands-free cell phones and avoiding texting, e-mailing, accessing the Web, tuning radios and stereos, and looking at maps while driving; and

WHEREAS: Auto crash fatalities affect all members of our communities, therefore it is necessary for all citizens to be involved in finding solutions and encouraging driver safety; and

WHEREAS: All citizens need to examine their own driving habits and commit to protecting others on the road through mindful driving; and

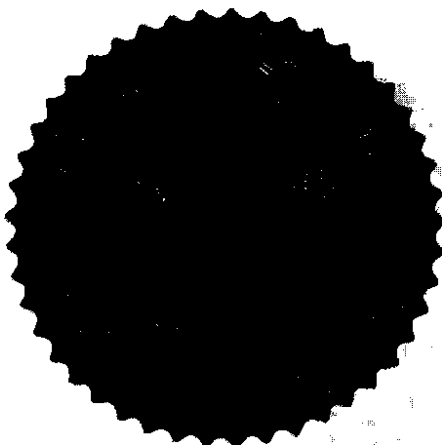
WHEREAS: Driver safety education programs work when partnerships are created between drivers of all ages, driver education schools, social communities, faith groups, public safety departments, local and state police departments, and the business community.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM PAWLENTY, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, August 1, 2009, to be:

DISTRACTION-FREE DRIVING DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
