



Our work together: Our diverse teams worked seamlessly together on ambitious design-build projects for clients like Bank for Good and Race Counts, EdFuel, and MPR - Talking Sense.

>>> **New Visions:** is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to create career pathways by providing coding and digital literacy training to youth in historically excluded communities.

Our work together: The idea of partnership was born five years ago, when New Vision founder Hussein Farah and Sharon Kennedy Vickers, now Software for Good's CEO, were both Bush Foundation Fellows. The City of Saint Paul and Ramsey County, Minnesota, chose New Vision Foundation and Software for Good to train the next generation of diverse local software engineering talent. With \$1.2 million in funding from the federal American Rescue Plan, 30 young people of color from Ramsey County will learn and earn. This partnership will provide these new technologists with the opportunity to build lifelong careers, strengthen our local communities and economy.

**Ecotone, GBC:** is a research and strategy consultancy working alongside social and environmental innovators to reimagine a better future and drafting blueprints for how to get there.

Our work together: Ecotone co-created an impact model to quantify the social return on Ramsey County's \$1.2 million investment to Software Good and New Vision's Coding Bootcamp & Apprentice program — making future investments in a diverse local tech workforce even easier to make.

Amethyst Advisory Group: Owned and led by Shawntera Hardy, a dynamic entrepreneur who has built four companies, led high profile organizations in both the public and private sectors, and managed many complex projects. Shawntera M. Hardy can be found working at the intersection of inclusive economies, technology, and public policy. 




#### Love

Impact Area: Media






Service(s) Provided: Web Application Development (Provoc: Design & User Research)

EdFuel helps educational organizations build talent systems with a diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility (DEIA) focus. As a small organization, they've had great results and impact with direct coaching, but want to expand their impact by offering tools to complement their hands-on work.

Working with EdFuel and Provoc, we've built and launched a beta version of an online platform with diagnostic tools, a talent calendar builder, and contextually relevant resources. I've had a great experience working collaboratively with this team over several rounds of user research, iteratively building an integrated set of tools focused on helping EdFuel's clients. We're continuing to work toward a wider launch later this year.

This platform will enable EdFuel to have a much larger impact. It will integrate with their coaching and make their expertise available to more organizations, helping talent leads access the resources and tools they need to make progress on both their immediate needs and the strategic long-term work of building better, more DEIA-focused talent systems.

#### **Innocent Technologies**

INVOCENT

Impact Area: Education

Service(s) Provided: User Experience Research & Design, Product Strategy

Innocent Technologies approached Software for Good with the challenge of developing a functional prototype of a habit-forming and skill-building software application aimed at improving students' educational outcomes by helping educators form strong relationships with students. The application is built on an established evidence base from Innocent Classroom's 12 years of experience, research, and evaluation of delivering classroom training to educators.

Our country faces enormous problems in our K-12 schools. We are tackling one its most serious: racial disparities in academics and performance. The nation's inability to boost achievement and opportunity for students of color is repeated in every state, where Black, brown, and Indigenous students trail their white counterparts by every measure and in every discipline. This imposes a permanent recession on families of color and costs the American economy an estimated \$2.3 trillion annually in economic output. Despite the efforts of educators, the stated commitments of political leaders, and generous funding, our K-12 schools fail Black, brown, and Indigenous children every day. Current solutions are based on an out-of-date industrial model of education infused with negative narratives and predetermined outcomes for Black, brown and Indigenous students.

Software for Good worked with Innocent Technologies to create a prototype application and product strategy with the following goals and core product functionality:

- Teacher-driven skill building software application founded on experience and evidence
- Generates immediately useful relationship building strategies in less than five minutes
- Suggests targeted interventions for individual students from over 1000 evidence-based strategies
- Dashboards bring science to assessing the quality of relationships and connections in a classroom, school, or district
- Tiered strategies to meet the specific needs of each child
- Easy to use interface saves time and generates strategies that have immediate benefit

As innocent Technologies begins its next step toward building and launching their software product, we are thrilled to see them get closer to achieving their vision: every child in every classroom is seen, valued, and heard and is excelling in school.

#### City of Saint Paul - RecTrac



Impact Area: GovTech

Service(s) Provided: Tech Assessment & Strategy

When the City of St. Paul's Parks and Recreation department decided to migrate to RecTrac, a recreation management system that handles payment and site logistics for parks, zoos, rec centers, pools, and other recreational spaces across the country, the department asked us to help them through the transition. Our team took a systems approach to cleaning up old data and helping migrate all of their existing sites, rentals, activities, and inventory into RecTrac. We also used process mapping, training materials and templates, and human-centered UX design work to shape their new registration pages and Point of Sale layouts. After a successful launch, we're now working with the department on steps towards a new data governance plan to ensure that future migrations run smoothly and that processes support good data stewardship and security.

#### Clean Energy Economy MN



Impact Area: Clean Energy

Service(s) Provided: Tech Assessment (CRM Assessment)

Clean Energy Economy Minnesota came to us with a question: was Salesforce the right CRM solution for their growing nonprofit team? After using Salesforce for years, they felt that they weren't using all of the features available to them and were having a hard time keeping their systems updated. After interviewing key stakeholders, mapping out their current and ideal states for their data systems, and seeing how internal departments and frequently used apps communicated with each other, we determined that a simpler, more user-friendly CRM would be a better fit for their team. Our recommendations will help them build a more user-centered CRM experience that allows them to track key information about their members without overwhelming their team, allowing them to build a foundation of wins towards better data governance and process.

#### City of Saint Paul - OTC/BCS

The City of Saint Paul Office of Technology and Communications (OTC) has a team that supports departments across the City to make tech process improvements and tech investments: Business and Consulting Services (BCS). This dynamic team leverages their business intelligence, user experience and solution design expertise to vet new tech investments and design tech improvements that make sense for end users. Software for Good's Product Strategy team plays a similar role with our clients, and BCS approached us to share our approaches, adapting them to their public sector context. Over the course of five months, our team developed an Agile toolkit with shared values we heard from the team to remind them of purpose, and tools and templates to use at each phase of client engagements. As a newer addition to OTC's work, SfG's work will support the BCS team in the next phase of their development: they are ready to dive deeper into complex tech opportunities across the City and provide value that incorporates the genius of their team.

#### **Abortion Funds**

Impact Area: Reproductive Justice

Service(s) Provided: Maintenance, Software Development

As abortion access organizations sought to make their work sustainable long-term, Software for Good has collaborated with a growing number of software projects to support the fight for reproductive justice. Software for Good's maintenance team continues to support the Midwest Access Coalition and the Northwest Abortion Access Fund, providing volunteer developers a sustaining partnership to continue their work.

We also implemented evolutionary changes to some of the software that powers the movement. Early in the year, our team worked with DARIA Services to implement security features that ensure privacy and safety for funds and abortion seekers. And when Midwest Access Coalition wanted to enable other funds to use the application they developed, Software for Good took on the work of moving the application to a multi-tenant model. These fundamental changes to applications continue our work to support bodily autonomy for everyone.

#### **The Good Acre**

THE GOOD ACRE

Impact Area: Food Sovereignty

Service(s) Provided: Tech Assessment and Product Strategy

The Good Acre (TGA) connects farmers and food entrepreneurs to the marketplace by sourcing products and providing farmer support services. TGA centers and amplifies Black, Indigenous and other people of color in their work. TGA approached Software for Good because they didn't have the digital infrastructure they needed to support relationship management with customers to help grow and scale their work around market access. Software for Good conducted interviews with team members, observed produce coming into the dock, analyzed current technology systems, and documented current state platform architecture. In an interactive workshop, we helped the TGA team identify how the current technology tools the organization is using did not support the organization's theory of change, and we designed a future state platform that more closely aligned with how the organization seeks to drive value and impact in the food system. We also identified short term wins that can help TGA optimize their current systems while they plan for the future.

#### **Apprenticeship**



Impact Area: Education

Ramsey County, Minnesota, has chosen New Vision Foundation and Software for Good to train the next generation of diverse local software engineering talent with \$1.2 million in funding from the federal American Rescue Plan, invested in partnership with the City of Saint Paul.

Starting in 2023, the first annual cohort of ten Ramsey County residents, all people of color, between 18 and 30 years old, with no previous software experience, participated in the program. Participants began with a six-month full-stack software engineering bootcamp, co-developed by Software for Good and taught by New Vision Foundation's expert all-BIPOC instructor team. Then, beginning in 2024, bootcamp graduates will spend four more months working as Software for Good apprentices, working shoulder to shoulder with our engineers and strategists on real-world software projects.

Every graduate of Software for Good's previous iterations of the apprenticeship program has either found a full-time job in the tech industry or pursued further education. In fact, Chelsey McKinney, a tech co-lead/Software Engineer for the apprenticeship program, got their start in tech as an apprentice for Software For Good. "With this partnership between SfG, New Vision Foundation and Ramsey County, the apprenticeship program will go a new direction that transfuses the classic program elements that I experienced with new elements, making the apprenticeship program more robust for the incoming class. Mentoring SfG apprentices has given me the opportunity to continue to provide sponsorship for developers of color looking to join tech."

Edith Emmings, Senior Software Engineer, believes "SfG's apprentice program is an investment in enriching our local tech workforce, and this year it is set up for success like never before. After going through a bootcamp together, the cohort joins SfG with a shared skillset, a sense of camaraderie, and a 6-month investment in this path. The funding has provided us with more time to prepare, manage and mentor throughout the program. As a former bootcamper myself, I remember how it feels to take that leap. I'm thrilled to be a part of a program that provides such strong support for the next generation of technologists."

### Sharon Kennedy Vickers, CEO, participated in Social Venture Institute at Hollyhock




